#### **ACTION ALERT**

Last week, SNA sent its <u>letter of recommendations</u> to U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack on current supply chain disruptions and how USDA can ease pressure on school nutrition programs struggling with procurement issues.

SNA continues to monitor supply chain disruptions and their impact on school meal programs.

TAKE ACTION NOW! Share SNA's letter with your Member of Congress to inform your Senators and Representatives and urge them to work with USDA on the latest supply chain issues affecting school meal programs.

#### COVID-19 Nationwide Waivers Extended for 2021-2022 School Year

The Biden Administration <u>announced the extension</u> of several COVID-19 waivers to ensure students can continue to safely receive free school meals through the 2021-22 School Year. All schools in States that opt in are permitted to serve and claim meals through the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) through the 2021-22 School Year. The waivers also allow schools to continue receiving the higher per-meal reimbursement rate offered under the Summer Food Service Program. Further, USDA is issuing a nationwide waiver to allow schools to utilize specific meal pattern flexibilities. Read more in <u>SNA's press release</u>. #### Colo. districts integrate agriculture in curriculum

Hayden School District and South Routt School District RE-3 in Colorado are using a \$1 million state grant to expand agriculture education to pre-K through 12th-grade students. That includes teaching students where their food comes from by having students plant and harvest food and learn to cook.

#### **HB21-1162 Management Of Plastic Products**

HB21-1162 that prohibits the use of polystyrene products in food establishments was approved and signed July 6, 2021. We were able to work with the bill sponsors on extending the date for implementation in the schools by one year. The bill sponsors agreed to remove the excessive fine structure for K-12. 
