- Humor and wellness to soothe the soul.



PPL Corner Healthy School Meals for All Proposition FF

Colorado House Bill (HB) 1414 created a ballot initiative for November 2022 (Proposition FF) to provide meals at no cost to Colorado students while also providing additional support to districts for local procurement and employee salary stipends. CSNA is excited to support this initiative and below is an overview of the initiative and what it means for school nutrition in CO.

- If approved by voters in November, districts will choose to opt-in to the program or not.
- If participating, a district will be able to provide breakfast and lunch meals at no cost to all students starting in school year 2023-24.
 - All eligible meals will be reimbursed to the district at the federal free reimbursement rate– either through federal reimbursement or using funds from this state initiative program.
 - Districts must maximize federal reimbursement by participating in Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) at all sites that are eligible.

*Using this program a district may be operating CEP district-wide, at some sites or not at all depending on the district.

*Free and Reduced meal applications must still be collected at all sites not participating in CEP.

- *Colorado has applied to participate in the Medicaid Demonstration Project which would allow for Medicaid eligibility to be used for Direct Certification. As soon as this data is available, it will be used to determine sites eligible for CEP – likely increasing the number of sites eligible due to higher numbers of students in Direct Certification.
- All eligible meals that are not reimbursed at the federal free rate through CEP, Direct Certification, or by income application will be reimbursed to the district using state funds.
 *State programs such as Smart Start Breakfast and the Lunch Protection Act will still pay the reduced-price copay.
- This program will be funding by limiting Colorado income tax deductions for those earning over \$300,000 per year. For single filers, the deductions will be limited to \$12,000 and for households, the deduction is limited to \$16,000. This is estimated to raise approximately \$101,000,000 per year.
- Additional programs will begin in school year 2024-25.
